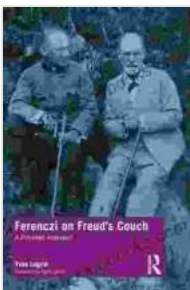


Ferenczi On Freud's Couch: Finished Analysis, Unfinished Legacy
