Fawad's memoir, 'Hope of the Heart,' was published in 2010. The book tells the story of her life and work as a nurse and peace activist.

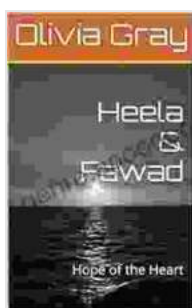
Fawad currently lives in Jordan, where she continues to work as a nurse and advocate for peace.
