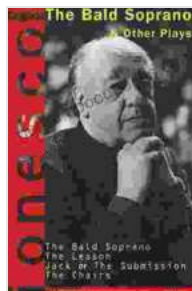


The Bald Soprano and Other Plays: A Masterpiece of the Theatre of the Absurd

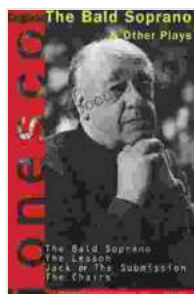
